#### Invitation for Expressions of Interest for: Artistic workshop for adults leader

The Penwith Landscape Partnership (PLP) aims to deliver a National Lottery Heritage Fund supported programme of work to conserve and enhance the unique landscape of Penwith (for more information visit our website at [www.penwithlandscape.com](http://www.penwithlandscape.com)). Our work consists of thirteen projects, one of which is **Seeing the Landscape**. This project includes several ambitious targets for engaging the local population and visitors in arts and culture within the Penwith landscape.

We wish to invite Expressions of Interest for an enthusiastic individual to lead artistic activity workshops for adults based around the Penwith Landscape during summer of 2020 and 2021, most likely as part of the Lafrowda Festival held in St Just every July.

TR19 7LB by Monday 16<sup>th</sup> March, at 12 noon.** Expressions of Interest will then be shortlisted to those who will be invited to apply in full for the contract – the successful candidate will then be chosen from these.

#### Contract Summary

We will ask the successful contractor to lead workshops or drop-in activities aimed at adults, encouraging them to use the arts to celebrate the Penwith landscape. The aim is to hold at least two workshops, one in July 2020 and one in July 2021. We aim to hold these as part of the Lafrowda festival fortnight, held each July in St Just. The workshops will need to relate strongly to the Penwith landscape as well as tying in to the theme of the Lafrowda festival each year (for 2020 this is “Roll up, roll up, Lafrowda comes to town”; the theme for 2021 will be announced in September 2020). The venue for these workshops will be in or around St Just.

It will be the responsibility of the successful candidate to suggest the form and content of these workshops, including what artistic medium they take place in. We encourage candidates to come up with different types of activity, as long as they all relate to the broader theme of the Penwith Landscape and are appropriate for the venue and audience. The candidate is welcome to suggest venues for workshops to allow the exploration of a range of types of artistic medium if appropriate. The contractor will also need to keep records and submit brief annual reports on their work.

#### Person(s) Specification

##### Essential:

- A passion for and experience in working with the arts
- Experience of leading groups or classes in artistic activities
- Experience of planning and leading events
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Enthusiastic and approachable
- Imaginative and creative
- Self-discipline and an ability to work independently when needed

- A knowledge of the Penwith area and its landscape
- Able to work with the Penwith Landscape Partnership team (who include specialist staff working on the thirteen programme project) to explore the potential to relate the content of the artistic workshops with the themes of PLP
- Ability to commit to the project for its duration (until summer 2021)
- Experience of undertaking risk assessments and taking responsibility for Health and Safety for activities
- To possess or be willing to possess an advanced DBS check if it is felt necessary
- Certified First Aider, or willingness to become a certified First Aider (PLP may be able to provide a free place on an appropriate course)

**Desirable:**

- In depth knowledge of the history of Penwith and a strong understanding of current Penwith and the sensitivities that surround it
