Invitation for an Expression of Interest for: Short Story workshop leader and competition judge

The Penwith Landscape Partnership (PLP) aims to deliver a National Lottery Heritage Fund supported programme of work to conserve and enhance the unique landscape of Penwith (for more information visit our website at www.penwithlandscape.com). Our work consists of thirteen projects, one of which is **Seeing the Landscape**. This project includes several ambitious targets for engaging the local population and visitors in arts and culture within the Penwith landscape.

We wish to invite Expressions of Interest for an artistic and enthusiastic individual to lead a short story workshop with a theme related to the Penwith Landscape to be held as part of the Penzance Literary Festival on 30th June 2020, and to subsequently act as a judge for a short story competition launched at the event and closing in Autumn 2020, with winning entries to be featured on the Penwith Landscape Partnership website

Contract Summary

We will ask the successful contractor to lead a workshop aimed at adults on short-story writing as part of the Penzance Literary festival on 30th June 2020 in the Knut, St Just. This workshop will be related to both the Penwith landscape and the theme for Literary Festival which is 'Breakaway'. It will be the responsibility of the successful candidate to suggest the exact form and content of the workshop, including the maximum number of attendees. Also during the festival a short story competition based around Penwith will be launched, and this contract also covers judging and promoting the winner of the competition in September-October 2020, with judging to take place in the PLP office in St Just. The successful candidate will also need to write a report on the workshop and competition.
