## Looking ahead to a busy summer

Welcome to another newsletter from the Penwith Landscape Partnership (PLP). Over the recent months we have undertaken a large amount of vegetation clearance at access trails

and ancient sites. In this newsletter we are looking ahead to our summer activities.

The coming of the summer months brings with it bird-nesting season, and as such we will not be undertaking vegetation clearance over the spring and early summer. However, we will have a range of other exciting activities for our volunteers to get involved with, including:

- · Cornish hedge repairs.
- Installation of gates, stiles and upgrading of footpaths.
- Local Landscape Character Assessments recording of landscape features.
- Light trimming of Ancient Sites vegetation.
- · Archaeological recording.
- Wildlife identification training and surveys including birds, wildflowers, butterflies and dragonflies.
- Activities surrounding the collection, storing and scattering of wildflower seeds to increase the biodiversity of Penwith.
- Invasive species management including rhododendron.

We have the following free events coming up. If you would like to register or learn more ring 01736 805300.

- 30th April (7pm on) and 8th June (10am-3.30pm) Local Landscape Character Assessment Workshops, Ludgvan- These two workshops will introduce to volunteers how to undertake Local Landscape Character Assessments.
- 15th May and 9th June- **Small Pearl Bordered Fritillary butterfly identification and recording workshop** (9.30am- 4.30pm) This workshop will give volunteers the ability to identify new colonies of this increasingly rare species. It will be held in St Just on 15th May and again in Zennor on 9th June.
- 11th June (6.30pm on) and 22nd June (10am-3.30pm) Local Landscape Character Assessment Workshops, Zennor- These two workshops will introduce to volunteers how to undertake Local Landscape Character Assessments.
- 26th-27th July- **Bog Dragonfly identification and recording** (St Just 9.30am-4.30pm). This 2 day workshop will train volunteers to identify and record the presence of the small red damselfly, and a handful of other dragonfly and damselflies in Penwith.
- Every Tues- **Archaeological Surveying** (various locations, 9.45am-3pm) Join our volunteers in surveying unique ancient sites in Penwith. Training, equipment and refreshments are supplied.
- Every Weds and Thurs **Volunteer Days** (various locations 9.45am-3pm). Join our regular volunteer days undertaking a range of tasks from footpath improvement to Cornish hedging. Training, tools and refreshments supplied.

# Make a difference to your local landscape with That's Our Parish

Yth yw agan Pluw That's Our Parish (Project 1.2) aims to encourage Penwith residents to become more aware of their local heritage through supporting Local Landscape Character Assessments within eleven parishes of Penwith. To support this we will be offering a variety of training to volunteers on recording their local culture and history, as well as recording species and biodiversity.

Our programme of Local Landscape Character Assessments begins with Ludgvan, where we are offering introductory workshops on 30<sup>th</sup> April and 8<sup>th</sup> June- the evening session on the 30<sup>th</sup> introduces the process, while the day long workshop on 8<sup>th</sup> June introduces the practical skills- and those attending will also get a free pasty! Two similar workshops for Zennor will be held at Zennor Village Hall on 11<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> June.
